1. Security clearance

A clearance request is mandatory prior to any mission to Congo. Login to ISECT at <u>https://dss.un.org/</u> to submit your clearance request. You should complete the following two courses:

- Basic Security in the Field;
- Advanced Security in the Field.

2. Geographical location of the Regional Office

The Regional Office is located to the south of Brazzaville. This is in Makelékelé District. The Regional Office is 12 km south of the City Center. It is on National Highway 1 and is part of the Pool Region.

3. Public transport

- Mini-Buses for public transport are painted green and white. They are not recommended.
- Taxis, also painted green and white, are recommended.
- You should always note down the number plate of the taxi.

6. Your personal security

Very important

Contact the WHO Security Office upon arrival, for your briefing

At the hotel (or place of stay)

- Your accommodation should be within the security perimeter (see below for the list of recommended hotels);
- Do not open your hotel room to strangers or unknown persons;
- Keep the emergency numbers listed in (7) below.

On the street

- Always be alert and aware of people around you (eye contact);
- Walk close to the curb with a steady pace and in well lit areas;
- Avoid walking alone at dusk or especially near bars, hotels, restaurants and dance halls;
- Do not respond to conversations from unfamiliar persons;
- Do not display money or valuable items;
- Hold your handbag securely between your arm and your body.

If you are using a car

- Carry your UNLP or ID documents to cross checkpoints;
- Avoid traveling alone and at night and always lock vehicle doors and keep windows rolled up;
- Park in well lit areas only and have your keys ready to enter your car without lingering;
- Do not leave anything visible on the back seat;
- Avoid demonstrators on public roads;
- If you suspect you are being followed, drive to a public place;
- If your car breaks down in dark areas or in a crowded or unsafe place, stay in the locked car and call FSO or LSA immediately; you should politely decline assistance offered by unfamiliar persons;
- Refrain from assisting motorists who stop on the roadside; rather, request help for them;
- Never resist in case of attack; always keep a low profile.
