## Dear colleagues,

The Joint Inspection Unit of the United Nations system (JIU) is pleased to announce the release of its report on the internal pre-tribunal stage appeal mechanisms available to staff of the United Nations system organizations prepared by Inspectors <u>Gönke Roscher</u> and Jesús S. Miranda-Hita.

The JIU initiated a review to assess the setup and operation of internal pre-tribunal stage appeal mechanisms within the United Nations system organizations, with the aim of informing legislative bodies and executive heads about the adequacy of these mechanisms in providing recourse, ensuring due process, and instilling confidence in their ability to meet the objectives set by legislative frameworks, based on parameters like fairness, integrity, transparency, impartiality, effectiveness, and efficiency.

These internal pre-tribunal stage appeal mechanisms refer to the initial phase in the formal process of resolving employment-related disputes. As per the procedural rules of the United Nations system organizations, it is a mandatory step that staff must undergo to challenge administrative decisions internally before they can appeal to an external administrative tribunal, making it an integral component of the internal justice system of international organizations.

This is the first time JIU has mapped the diversity of pre-tribunal-stage appeal mechanisms available to staff across the United Nations system organizations who wish to formally challenge administrative decisions internally.

The review makes **7 recommendations**, of which 5 are addressed to the executive heads and 2 to the legislative organs and governing bodies of the United Nations system organizations for action. 23 informal recommendations complement these.
