Issue description (including reach: global versus local)	The 2016 cost of living survey of Geneva caused a 5.2% drop in the net remuneration of the staff of the Geneva organizations. Because of the Geneva staff disapproval, ICSC decided in 2018 to review the Post Adjustment methodology and the operational rules that determine the post adjustment index.  "The overall purpose of the current system of operational rules was to ensure that the adjustment of the salaries of the United Nations common system staff in the Professional and higher categories was in line with specific compensation policy objectives, including accuracy, stability and predictability of salary adjustments, as well as simplicity and transparency of the salary-setting process".  The objectives of this session are:  • To have a clear understanding of new developments on the revised methodology for P & D staff.  • To learn about the latest recommendations that were proposed by the ICSC or the working group.  • To learn about the next meetings planned this year and the training needs.
